



At the October 19th meeting Sojourners learned that the only volunteer organization that empowers citizens to speak on behalf of neglected and abused children are advocates of CASA-CAN. Lisa Goff, Executive Director, spoke to the group about Court Appointed Special Advocates, appointed by a local judge to be the voice of these children. Every child has a guardian ad litem because there is no one else to speak for the child.

Member Kathy Schlimgen, after undergoing pre-service training, participating in a mock trial, and court appointed, is now a CASA

advocate. Currently there are over 600 children in the local program with less than one hundred CASA-CAN volunteers serving these vulnerable children.



Those interested in becoming volunteers are urged to contact CASA-CAN.




Officer Dan O'Fallon, Detention Center Commander, spoke to Sojourners at the November 2nd meeting on the topic of Scams and Scamming, currently a serious issue. He admitted that when planning his talk, his first thought was his talk would last about 30 seconds because the best advice is "Just say, NO".

Several subjects were discussed: refusing telemarketer calls, door to door solicitors, cyber security, sex offenders living in residential areas, safety rules and reminders, epidemic substance abuse and escalating increase of crime in our area (jail population), and the prevalence of guns in the community.

A lengthy question and answer period followed Officer O'Fallon's remarks with members leaving much wiser and better armed with safety precaution reminders.
